Stephen P. Cass, M.D. Professor & senior Neurotologist in the Department of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery University of Colorado Anschutz Medical Campus in Denver Colorado (USA). Dr Cass has clinical and research interest in vestibular disorders, cochlear implantation, chronic ear disease and skull base surgery. Other fields of clinical interest are skull base surgery and brainstem and midbrain implants. He is on the Faculty of the Course since 15 years






